To successfully Start anything – you must make right choices

Faith is when somebody really trusts in God and believes that God honest and truly has his or her best interest at heart

Moses is a great example of what it means to successfully Start and finish right.

Things that Faith rejects:

I. Faith rejects the world's Prestige

"By faith Moses, when he became of age, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter,"

(Hebrews 11:24)

“Now when he was forty years old, it came into his heart to visit his brethren, the children of Israel.

(Acts 7:23)

“Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him.
